No Time for Caution

About a year ago, I had the joy of attending an organ recital by the remarkable Anna Lapwood—then Director of Music at Pembroke College, Cambridge, and now the official organist of the Royal Albert Hall. The concert took place in the awe-inspiring setting of Glasgow Cathedral, with its intricate Gothic architecture and radiant stained glass windows forming the perfect backdrop for an evening of musical brilliance.

Anna's repertoire spans a wide range of genres, but she is especially known for her breathtaking transcriptions of film scores for the organ—a delightful treat for film lovers like myself. One such piece was No Time for Caution by Hans Zimmer, composed for Christopher Nolan's 2014 science fiction epic, Interstellar.



The music underscores a pivotal scene in the film, where two astronauts must attempt an impossible docking with a space station that's spinning out of control. Failure means the end of humanity. Zimmer's spiralling theme builds with tension and urgency, perfectly echoing the high-stakes moment on screen. It's a piece that grips you—especially when performed live by someone as gifted as Anna.

As I sat in the Cathedral, utterly absorbed in her performance, I glanced up at a window depicting the four Evangelists. It struck me how fitting the title No Time for Caution felt in that sacred space. The Gospels are filled with moments of bold, immediate action: Jesus calling Matthew, "Come, follow me"; the Gospel of Mark's characteristic urgency, with its frequent refrain "At once..."; and, of course, the dramatic events of Pentecost. Caution, it seems, is often set aside when it comes to following Christ.

Twelve months later, that phrase returns to me as I read some of Pope Leo XIV's first words: "Do not wait, but respond enthusiastically to the Lord." His words echo those of Popes throughout the ages, encouraging Catholics around the world to listen for their calling and respond with urgency. For a Christian, the fundamental vocation is the adventure of following Jesus Christ in faith. It is a call to grow in love and holiness. Our ultimate vocation is to share God's life in the glory of heaven—to see Him face to face. This is what we are made for.

Following Christ isn't safe. In contrast to a culture that prizes comfort, security, and the freedom to "be ourselves," our faith calls us to take risks—to surrender our ego-dramas, where we write, direct, and star in our own lives—and instead enter into God's grand theo-drama: a story written, produced, and directed by the Lord Himself.

There's no time for caution. But there is time—always—for faith, for courage, and for stepping boldly into the life God is calling us to live.

Liturgical Calendar

Monday 4th August, St John Marie Vianney, Patron of Parish Priests - Born near Lyons (France) in 1786; died at Ars on this day in 1859. Overcame various obstacles, including little education and lack of means, to be ordained a priest. Served in a remote parish as the Curé of Ars, where his sanctity attracted thousands of visitors. Noted for his preaching and confessional counsel and is honoured as a model for parish clergy.

Tuesday 5th August, Dedication of the Basilica of St Mary Major - This major stational church of the ancient Roman liturgy, erected in the fourth century, was rebuilt and dedicated by Sixtus III following the proclamation at the Council of Ephesus (431) of the doctrine of Mary, Mother of God. It is considered the oldest church dedicated to our Lady in the Western world.

Wednesday 6th August, The Transfiguration of the Lord Jesus - This feast had its origin in the East in the fourth century as the commemoration of the dedication of the church of the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. It was observed in the West from the eighth century and extended to the entire Western Church in the fifteenth century. The feast celebrates the divine radiance shining in Christ's human flesh and God's glory shining forth in the lives of Christians.

Thursday 7th August, Pope St Sixtus & Companions, Martyrs - They died on 6 August 258, martyred the year after his election as bishop of Rome during the persecution of the emperor Valerian. According to his contemporary, Saint Cyprian, he was "not so much killed as crowned," along with four deacons, while addressing a congregation. Honoured as one of the most popular Roman martyrs, and mentioned in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon).

Friday 8th August, St Dominic, Priest - Born in Castile (part of modern Spain) and became a canon of the cathedral of Osma. He accompanied his bishop in a mission of preaching against the Albigensian heresy, which was then strong in southern France, living in extreme poverty. In 1216 he founded the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), dedicated to saving souls by preaching, persuasion and a life of poverty. He died at Bologna on 6th August 1221.

Saturday 9th August, St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Virgin & Martyr - Born on 12 October 1891 in Wroclaw (Poland); died on this day in 1942 at Auschwitz/Oswiecim. Edith Stein, born of Jewish parents, became an outstanding philosopher, author and teacher, then discovered Christianity and Teresa of Avila, and so was baptised in 1922. Became a Discalced Carmelite, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. When the Dutch bishops protested the Nazi persecution of the Jews, she was deported to Auschwitz along with all Dutch Catholics of Jewish extraction. Honoured as a victim of anti-Semitism, a scholar, contemplative and martyr for whom the cross is the key to spiritual understanding.

St Mary's Lost property
