## A Grumpy Old Catholic Starts Advent

When it comes to observing the Church's liturgical calendar in an increasingly secular world, I often think of myself as a "Grumpy Old Catholic." My eyes roll when Easter eggs appear in January. I sigh when hot-cross buns are sold all year round. I mutter when Lent passes unnoticed. I despair when the fifty-day season of Eastertide is reduced to one chocolate-fuelled Sunday. And when Christians abandon the Catholic roots of Hallowe'en in favour of "Hallelujah Parties", I can feel my blood pressure rise. By September, when the first Christmas displays go up, I'm practically incandescent.

Advent is no exception. Like Lent, it's a penitential season, yet also one of longing and joyful expectation. But in practice, it is often swept aside by novelty calendars, wall-to-wall Christmas music, and adverts insisting that anything but Christ is the "true meaning of Christmas," usually accompanied by a strong nudge toward a spending spree. I'll leave the economics of gift-giving to The Money Saving Expert (search: "Martin Lewis: Is it time to ban unnecessary Christmas presents?"), but the spiritual consequences are worth our attention.

In my grumpiness, what am I to do? Today's first reading offers a helpful starting point for Advent: "The mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills." This striking image invites a spiritual stock-take. What are the "hills" in our lives - job, family, friends, or even the demands of parish life? And what stands as our "highest mountain"? Is it truly Christ, or have the hills quietly taken His place on our horizon?

The invitation is simple but challenging: order everything - our hills - around Christ. The hills themselves aren't bad; they are often the very places where God works most powerfully. But when they dominate the landscape, we lose sight of the One who gives them purpose. Our lives become disordered, and the streams of grace that should flow from Christ are diverted or blocked. When Christ is again our highest mountain, our lives regain clarity and balance.

As for gift giving, at the risk of contradicting my own complaints about premature Christmas music, I'm reminded of Christina Rossetti's line: "What can I give Him, poor as I am? ... Yet what I can I give Him, give my heart." Rossetti captures a Biblical truth: the only gift God truly desires is the gift of ourselves.

But this gift is never merely individual. God gives each of us charisms, spiritual gifts, for the building up of His Body, the Church. Whether your charism lies in pastoral care, organisation, creativity, communication, healing, or contemplation, discerning it takes patience, prayer, and trust. This process is part of placing our lives under Christ's lordship, our highest mountain, not only for our personal growth but for the Church's good, so that "all nations shall stream toward it." When our gifts are offered to Christ, the true beauty of the Church's seasons can shine more brightly in the world.

So this Advent, before reaching for the tinsel or the to-do list, perhaps we might pause and ask: Is Christ still my highest mountain? And what charism can I offer Him and His Church this season

## Liturgical Calendar

**Monday 1st December, St Andrew, Apostle and Patron of Scotland** - Born at Bethsaida (Galilee). A fisherman and perhaps a disciple of John the Baptist. Introduced his brother, Simon Peter, to Jesus and became one of the first to follow Christ. Mentioned a number of times in the gospels, for example, in introducing some Gentiles to Jesus (John 12:20ff.). Widely venerated since ancient times and remembered as one of the twelve who bore witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

**Wednesday 3rd December, St Francis Xavier, Priest & Missionary** - Born in 1506 in Navarre (Spain); died on this day in 1552 off the coast of China. Francis Xavier met Ignatius of Loyola while both were studying in Paris and became one of the first Jesuits. At Ignatius' request, Francis went to Goa (India) as a missionary and travelled extensively through southeast Asia to Japan, winning converts and organising Christian communities. Francis Xavier was noted for the simplicity of his lifestyle and for his tireless missionary zeal.
