

## **Leading with Love and Courage**

Ever feel like the world is just too loud, too busy, or too broken to make a difference? That's kind of how the world looked when St. Gregory the Great was alive in the 6th century. Rome was falling apart, people were hungry and sick, and the Church was struggling. Gregory could've chosen an easy life—he came from a rich Roman family and had a successful career ahead of him. But he gave it all up to follow Jesus more closely.



At first, Gregory became a monk, living quietly in prayer and simplicity. But God called him out of his comfort zone. He became a deacon, then an ambassador, and eventually—though he really didn't want it—Pope in the year 590. He said yes not because he wanted power, but because he wanted to serve. In fact, he called himself "the servant of the servants of God", a phrase still used by popes today.

As pope, Gregory didn't just sit on a throne. He fed the poor, cared for the sick, helped rebuild society, and sent out missionaries to spread the Gospel—one of them being St. Augustine of Canterbury, who brought Christianity to England! Gregory also reformed how the Church worshipped and promoted the beautiful music we now call Gregorian Chant.

But here's what really makes Gregory "great": he led with humility, kindness, and a deep love for people. He believed leaders should serve others, not be served. He taught that faith isn't just something you believe—it's something you live. He reminded the Church that authority is meaningless without service, and knowledge is empty without love. His writings, especially the Pastoral Rule, laid out a vision how bishops and priests to shepherd their flocks—with humility, compassion and courage.

He once said: "The proof of love is in the works. Where love exists, it works great things." That's a challenge for all of us.

So, what can St. Gregory teach you?

- You don't have to be loud or famous to make a big impact.
- You don't have to have it all figured out to say yes to God.
- True greatness comes from serving others, especially when it's hard.

As we remember St. Gregory the Great, may we, too, embrace the call to serve—not only in grand ways, but in small daily acts of kindness, patience and love. May his example inspire us to be instruments of [eace and wisdom in our families, parish and community.

St. Gregory the Great, pray for us!

#### **Diocesan Vocations Mass**

Bishop Toal invites everyone in the diocese to join him on **Tuesday 16th September** for a special Mass praying for vocations to the priesthood at **7pm in Our Lady of Good Aid Cathedral, Motherwell, Ml1 1PP.** The Lord tells us in the Gospel—ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to the harvest, so to respond to that call of the Lord, please make a special effort to join Bishop Toal and the clergy of the diocese to ask the Lord to send us good, faithful and holy priests.

The Diocese of Motherwell has been very blessed in recent years to have priests ordained and others discerning their call—it shows the fruit of prayer. This summer, 3rd July, Father Christopher Furmage was ordained to the priesthood and Deacon Christopher Igwe will be ordained to the priesthood on Wednesday 3rd September in Motherwell Cathedral. Please pray for Fr Furmage and Fr Igwe as they take on their new responsibilities within the diocese.

#### **Liturgical Calendar**

Wednesday 3rd September, St Gregory the Great, Pope & Doctor - Born about 540; died in Rome in 604. While prefect of Rome, he founded monasteries there and in Sicily and himself became a monk. Called to be a deacon of Rome by Benedict I, and then sent as papal legate to Constantinople. Elected pope in 590. Reorganised Church life and administration in a time of crisis, sponsored liturgical reform, and initiated the evangelisation of the English. Known also for his extensive writings on pastoral care, spirituality, and morals, and for his self-designation as "servant of the servants of God."

Friday 5th September, St Tresea of Calcutta - Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu was born on 26th August 1910 at Skopje in Macedonia. She left home at the age of 18 to join the Sisters of Loreto in Ireland, where she received the name Sister Mary Teresa, after St Therese of Lisieux. In 1931 she was assigned to the order's Calcutta house and taught at their Scholle there, where she eventually became headmistress. She received an new vocation to help the poor and destitute, and in 1948, she left the convent and took up a life caring for them wherever they might be: lying sick in streets or even dying in dustbins. The new Congregation of the Missionaries of Charity was established in the Diocese of Calcutta in 1950, spreading across India and every continent, even behind the Iron Curtain. Moyher Teresa died on 5th September 1997 and was beatified by Pope John Paul II on 19th October 2003 and canonised by Pope Francis on 4th September 2016.
