

The Sacraments: Baptism

All sacraments are an encounter with Christ, who is himself the original sacrament. There are sacraments of initiation, which introduce the recipient into the faith: Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist. There are sacraments of healing: Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. And there are sacraments of communion and mission: Matrimony & Holy Orders. Baptism joins us with Christ.

Baptism is the foundational sacrament and the gateway for all other sacraments. It unites us the Jesus Christ, incorporates us into his redemptive death on the cross, thereby freeing us from the power of Original Sin and all personal sins, and causes us to rise with him to a life without end. Since Baptism is a covenant with God, the individual must say Yes to it. In the Baptism of children, the parents confess the Faith on behalf of the children.



Water used in Baptism, symbolises cleansing and new life, which was already expressed in the baptism of repentance performed by John the Baptist. Our Baptism in water is more than a sign of conversion and repentance, it is new life in Christ. That is why the ceremony also includes signs of anointing with oil, clothing with a white garment and the lighting of the baptismal candle. Any person who is not yet baptised can be baptised. The only prerequisite for Baptism is faith, which must be professed publicly at the Baptism.

Some Protestants argue that only adults should be baptised, but from antiquity the Church has practiced infant Baptism. There is one reason for this: before we decide on God, God has decided on us. Baptism is therefore a grace, an undeserved gift of God, who accepts us unconditionally. Just as every person is born and has the ability to breathe, so too every person is born with the ability to believe.

Normally the sacrament is administered by a bishop, priest or deacon. In an emergency, any Christian, indeed any person regardless of their faith, can baptise by pouring water over the head of the recipient and pronouncing the baptismal formula, 'I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.' Baptism is so important that even a non-Christian can administer it in an emergency.

Is Baptism the only way to salvation? For all those who have received the Gospel and have heard that Christ is "the way, and the truth, and the life" (John 14:6), Baptism is the only way to God and salvation. At the same time, however, it is true that Christ died for all mankind. Therefore all people who have had no opportunity to learn about Christ and the faith but seek God sincerely and live according to their conscience also find salvation (the so-called Baptism of desire).

The Church asks that there be a reasonable expectation, that a child who is put forward for Baptism, will be brought up in the practice of the Faith. Parents have the responsibility not only for their children's physical health and wellbeing but also their spiritual wellbeing too.

The book is priced at £15 and copies are available to buy from the stall.


St Mary's 300 Club

- 1. Please continue to speak clearly whilst projecting your voice directly into the microphone. If you whisper in, then a whisper comes out. If you need to, adjust the microphone before Mass to make sure it is in the correct position.
- 2. For the Universal Prayers of Intercession (Bidding Prayers) please make your way to the ambo during the final few lines of the Creed. The reader should be at the ambo and ready before the priest begins the Opening Prayer.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion:

1. For Communion, can the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion make their way to the sanctuary as soon as the "Lamb of God" begins. Extraordinary Ministers should be in place on the sanctuary for this prayer finishing and facing the altar for the priest saying: "Behold the Lamb of God".

Liturgical Calendar

Tuesday 23rd September, St Pio of Pietrelcina - Born on 25 May 1887 in Pietrelcina (Italy); died on this day in 1968 at San Giovanni Rotondo (Italy). Raised in a deeply religious rural home, Francesco Forgione became Padre Pio when he was ordained in the Capuchin order in 1910. A mystic who received the marks of the stigmata in 1918, a renowned holy man, and a charity worker who founded a hospital (the House for the Relief of Suffering). His ascetic life of pain led to special compassion for the suffering. Honoured as an extraordinary confessor and spiritual director.

Friday 26th September, Saints Cosmas and Damien, Martyrs - They died probably in Syria. Widely venerated as martyrs in the fifth and sixth centuries when basilicas were dedicated to them in Constantinople and Rome and when their names were included in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon). Later legend identified them as twin brothers who practiced medicine without charge to their patients.

Saturday 27th September, St Vincent de Paul - Born in Gascony (France) in 1581; died in Paris on this day in 1660. A parish priest who worked for the apostolic renewal of the clergy, founding the Congregation of the Mission (Vincentians or Lazarists) for missionary work in rural areas and for the formation of clergy. Committed above all to the oppressed and disadvantaged, he founded the Daughters of Charity with Louise de Marillac to work with the needy.
