# **The Sacraments: Suffering Made Sacred**

We turn to the saints to hold our petitions close to their hearts and to intercede on our behalf in tough times. However, the lives of the saints also provide the means by which we can understand Christ's Passion and suffering. Pope Benedict XVI taught us that Christ suffered with "infinite love". How do we reconcile love with suffering in our lives and in the lives of our family and friends? The paths travelled by three saints show us the way.

**St Bernadette of Lourdes'** concealment of her physical and emotional suffering was not in an effort to deny or minimise her struggles. Instead, it was her way of offering her pain to God. Following a diagnosis of tuberculosis in her right knee, St Bernadette suffered further complications which caused difficulty eating and extreme pain. She was confined to bed in the last years of her life and continued to



be inspired by her visions of the Virgin Mary. Her conscientiousness for those who cared for her makes St Bernadette's journey even more remarkable.

The visible wounds of Christ (stigmata) appeared on **St Pio of Pietrelcina's** body without warning and with great physical pain. Wounds appeared on St Pio's hands, feet and side. These marks brought agony but also scrutiny and doubt from those around St Pio. In the face of scepticism, St Pio accepted his suffering quietly and turned to prayer. When asked about his suffering, St Pio commented that to be on the cross with Jesus is "infinitely more perfect than merely contemplating Him on the cross".

**St Rita of Cascia** asked Christ to allow her to share in His' suffering. St Rita faced resistance to her wish to join the Monastery of St Mary Magdalene due to a rivalry between two local families. She encouraged peace between them. Thereafter, she began to live in accordance with the teachings of the Order of Augustine. Christ answered St Rita's prayer to partake in His suffering. A wound appeared on St Rita's forehead. This is described as the piercing of a thorn, similar to the crown of thorns which pierced Christ's brow. In the hillside gardens of Roccaporena, near Cascia, there is a powerful depiction of St Rita's suffering. The sculpture shows St Rita being handed a rose towards the end of her life. Accounts tell us that St Rita asked her relative to go out and pick a rose from the gardens. It was winter and the hills were covered in a blanket of snow. However, St Rita knew that her suffering would bring her closer to God. Her faith was rewarded. There, under the snow, was a single rose.

Three saints of different ages, genders and backgrounds. Three saints who took different, yet at times similar, approaches to suffering. Three saints who show us that bearing suffering with "infinite love" will bring us closer to God. Jesus' sacrifice on the cross did not bring an end to suffering in the world. However, in dying, He allowed us to suffer as He did. When we ask how we can put this into practice, at times when suffering affects not only our lives but the lives of those around us, let us pray to **St Bernadette**, **St Pio** and **St Rita** for their strength, humility and inspiration.

# **Liturgical Calendar**

Wednesday 22nd October, Pope St John Paul II - Karol Józef Wojtyla (1920-2005) served as Pope of the Catholic Church from 1978 to 2005. He was the second longest-serving pope in history after Pope Pius IX, who served for nearly 32 years (1846-1878). He helped to end Communist rule in Poland and eventually all of Europe. Doctrinally conservative, he quelled dissent on controversial issues such as artificial contraception and the ordination of women, but strongly emphasised the universal call to holiness.. He canonised 483 saints, more than all of his predecessors combined. He was beatified in 2011 by his successor Pope Benedict XVI and canonised in 2014 by Pope Francis.

Thursday 23rd October, St John Capistrano - Born in Capistrano (Italy) in 1386; died on this day in 1456 at Ilok (Croatia). Though a married man and governor of Perugia, he decided to join the Friars Minor and was released from his marriage vows. Professed as a Franciscan at the age of thirty and ordained a presbyter three years later. A successful preacher, committed Franciscan reformer, zealous inquisitor in Vienna, and spiritual leader of a victorious crusade against the Ottoman forces. Noted for his preaching and austerity of life.

Friday 24th October, St Anthony Claret, Bishop - Born in Sallent (Spain) in 1807; died in exile in France on this day in 1870. Spent more than a decade preaching missions and retreats in Catalonia, and founded a religious institute, later known as the Claretians, for this work. Was appointed archbishop of Santiago (Cuba) where he aroused opposition for his spiritual and social reforms and for championing the rights of the indigenous peoples. Finally, as chaplain to Queen Isabella II, drew the arts and sciences into his missionary endeavour. Noted for his work of religious renewal through the spoken and printed word.
