Powerhouse of Prayer

What is Prayer?

For the senior members of our parish, they will remember it from the Old Catechism as, The Raising up of the Mind and Heart to God. The revised Catechism has slightly different wording, but the message is the same.

My idea of prayer. PRAYER comes in many shapes and sizes. It's not a one size fits all. It doesn't always have to be solemn, it can be happy and joyful. It all depends on us and where we take our prayer to. It can be formal words or quiet thoughts. It can be a kind action or love shown to others in need. It can be said, sung or done anywhere or at anytime. It doesn't always have to be in a church, though, coming together to pray can be encouraging and strengthening. The Lord Himself said: "Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there with them."



For me, I've prayed in many places. Apart from praying in church, I sing hymns (badly) in my kitchen whilst cooking, in my living room with the sun streaming through, in winter with the curtains closed sheltering from the cold and dark or in the quiet of my bedroom and even on line praying the rosary with others to help my concentration. I pray the rosary better with others rather than on my own. Raising our minds and hearts to God in song was commended by Pope St. John Paul II. He once said that in singing we are praising God twice. I like that idea as it pleases me to think that my singing can be doubly pleasing to the Lord.

Perhaps there is a lack in my teaching skills as in my singing skills. Some time ago, I was teaching my grandchildren about what a Novena was. I told them if there was something they were upset about, they could make a Novena by praying to a saint of their choice to intercede for them to the Lord. The prayer would be said for nine days and if they believed and trusted in the Lord He would grant what was best for them. I also told them it had to be something important.

One of the grandchildren felt that she really needed something (bearing in mind she was only nine years old at the time) and she told me she had decided to do a Novena for her wishes to be granted. I asked her a couple of weeks later how her Novena had gone. She said that it was great and she only had to pray for four days as her wishes were granted after that. I realised I hadn't stressed too well the meaning of Novena being nine. I told her it can be nine days, nine weeks or even nine hours if you are challenged with a problem and need help quickly. The most powerful Novena I ever did was a nine hour Novena when I was ill in hospital. Thanks be to God it worked wonders for me.

Liturgical Calendar

Monday 8th December, The Immaculate Conception - This feast had its origin in the East as the "Conception of Mary by Saint Anne." It spread through the West during the Middle Ages as the "Immaculate Conception" and was extended to the entire Western Church in the eighteenth century. The feast celebrates Mary, preserved from sin from the moment of conception; she is the first fruits of her Son's redemption and a prophetic model of what the Church is called to be.

Wednesday 10th December, Our Lady of Loreto - Since the Middle Ages veneration for the Holy House of Loreto has been the origin of that particular shrine which still today is visited by many faithful pilgrims in order to nourish their faith in the Word of God made flesh for us. In the Holy House, before the image of the Mother of the Redeemer and of the Church, Saints and Blesseds have responded to their vocation, the sick have invoked consolation in suffering, the people of God have begun to praise and plead with Mary using the Litany of Loreto, which is known throughout the world. In a particular way all those who travel via aircraft have found in her their heavenly patron.

Friday 12th December, Our Lady of Guadalupe - The North American continent is honoured by the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe near Mexico City. On 9th December 1531, the Blessed Mother appeared to a simple Amer-Indian convert, Juan Diego. Her picture was miraculously impressed upon his cloak. Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, showed herself as a tender and compassionate mother.
