# St Mary Magdalene's Forth

Today, Sunday 27th March 2022, Bishop Toal will celebrate the final Mass in St Mary Magdalene's Mass Centre, Forth. For over 50 years St Mary Magdalene's has stood as a Catholic presence in the small village of Forth, and has been a place of worship for so many.

Today, we come with heavy hearts as we gather in St Mary Magdalene's one last time, but we come with thankful hearts to the Lord for the prayers offered in St Mary Magdalene's over the years, and for the graces received. We come in thanksgiving, remembering all those who have worshiped in St Mary Magdalen's over it's 50 years, especially those who have returned home to the Lord, and all those who have had a connect with St Mary Magdalene's and now moved away. For so many, St Mary Magdalene's has been the centre of their faith journey, and for this we are extremely thankful.



Although the Mass Centre will close today, a Catholic presence will still be prominent in Forth by the people who still live there. Through the lives of those still present in Forth, of that small community of believers who gathered every Sunday, faith will still be present in the community, through their actions and prayers. The Church is much more than a building, as Pope Francis reminds us, people are the Church: "Families are the domestic Church, where Jesus grows; he grows in the love of spouses, he grows in the lives of children. That is why the enemy so often attacks the family. The devil does not want the family; he tries to destroy it, to make sure that there is no love there. Families are this domestic Church."

Of course, we require the Church to receive the Sacraments and a building to gather in prayer, and the parishioners of St Mary Magdalene's will still do this by joining the people of St Mary's, Lanark, to celebrate Mass and to unite in our praise of God. This practice of both communities joining together has now been happening for several months, and it has been lovely to see the parishioners of St Mary Magdalene's being incorporated into the life and worship of St Mary's, and fulfilling ministries within the parish.

It is important that we do not forget St Mary Magdalene's and all the history, and all the goodness that has taken place in Forth over the last 50 years. Therefore, the icon of St Mary Magdalene, that is currently in the Mass Centre, will be rehoused in St Mary's, next to the Lady Altar, with a small plaque underneath, commemorating St Mary Magdalene's and all those who worshiped there. The Stations of the Cross from St Mary Magdalene's will be rehoused in St Mary's Primary School as a lasting sign of the link between St Mary Magdalene's Mass Centre and all the Forth children who attended St Mary's Primary School.

O God, whose Only Begotten Son entrusted Mary Magdalene before all others with announcing the great joy of the Resurrection, grant, we pray, that through her intercession and example we may proclaim the living Christ and come to see him reigning in your glory.

Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

# Gift Aid Appeal

As we begin to enter a new Financial Year, it is appropriate that the Parish offers everyone the opportunity to join the Gift Aid Scheme. If you are not already a member of the Gift Aid Scheme, and you pay tax on your pension or any earnings, we strongly encourage you to consider joining the Scheme. It takes minutes to join, your weekly donations can stay the same, and it is 100% confidential. For every £1 donated through Gift Aid, the Parish claims back 25%, at NO cost to you, it is claimed from the Government. Each Gift Aid user is issued a number, to keep all details confidential, and no matter how little or how large your offering, we can claim back 25% at the end of the Tax Year. If you would like to join the Gift Aid Scheme you can either, speak to Fr John-Paul, or fill out a Gift Aid Declaration Form and hand it in next week. If it is easier you can pop completed forms into the collection bag with your weekly offering and Fr John-Paul will deal with it from there. Last year St Mary's reclaimed f16,525.27 and St Isidore's f7,218.50. We are extremely grateful to those who support the church through Gift Aid, and with the rising cost of bills, we strongly encourage other tax payers to consider using the Scheme, and maximising your donations.
