Presentation of the Lord

Traditionally, the Church has set aside February 2nd in observance of the Presentation of the Lord – or the day in which Joseph and Mary presented Jesus to the priests and elders in the Temple.

For years, this feast marked the end of the Christmas season. In old days, the Presentation was often referred to as "Candlemas" and was celebrated by a candle-lit procession into the church, signifying Christ as the "light of nations."

Known originally as the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is a relatively ancient celebration. We know that the Church at Jerusalem was observing the feast as early as the first half of the fourth century, and likely earlier.



According to Jewish law, the firstborn male child belonged to God, and the parents had to "buy him back" on the 40th day after his birth, by offering a sacrifice of "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons" (Luke 2:24) in the temple — thus the "presentation" of the child. On that same day, the mother would be ritually purified — thus the "purification."

Our Blessed Lady and St Joseph kept this law, even though, since Mary remained a virgin after the birth of Christ, she would not have had to go through ritual purification. In his Gospel, Luke (2:22-39) recounts the story.

Originally, the feast was celebrated on February 14th, the 40th day after Epiphany (January 6th), because Christmas wasn't yet celebrated as its own feast, and so the Nativity, Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord, and the feast celebrating Christ's first miracle at the wedding in Cana were all celebrated on the same day. By the last quarter of the fourth century, however, the Church at Rome had begun to celebrate the Nativity on December 25th, so the Feast of the Presentation was moved to February 2nd, 40 days later.

When Christ was presented in the temple, "there was a man in Jerusalem named Simeon, and this man was just and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel." When Our Blessed Lady and St Joseph brought Christ to the temple, Simeon embraced the Child and prayed the Canticle of Simeon: "Now thou dost dismiss thy servant, O Lord, according to thy word in peace; because my eyes have seen thy salvation, which thou hast prepared before the face of all peoples: a light to the revelation of the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel" (Luke 2:29-32).

Because of the words of the canticle — "a light to the revelation of the Gentiles" — by the 11th century, the custom had developed in the West of blessing candles on the Feast of the Presentation. The candles were then lit, and a procession took place through the darkened church while the Canticle of Simeon was sung. Because of this, the feast also became known as Candlemas. While the procession and blessing of the candles is not often performed in many parishes today, Candlemas is still an important feast in the Church.

Wind Damage

Last week Storm Isha graced our lands with her presence, and left behind a trail of destruction, including damage to the Crucifix in front of the church. Since the renovation in 2012 the Calvary Scene has been an iconic image for St Mary's and sets the tone for our beautiful church. Fr John-Paul has contacted the man who made the Calvary Scene, although now retired, he has kindly agreed to reinstate the Crucifix. This is no easy task; he will need to carry out some repair work to the Corpus and make a completely new wooden cross.

The anchor system already in place has not been damaged and remains stable. The problem seems to be that water was gathering under the slabs and the wood of the cross was soaking up the water. In order to stop this happening in another 10 years time the engineer is designing a system that will secure the new cross and raise it out of the anchor point (above ground level) and allow the water to soak away. We are very grateful to the craftsmen who have kindly agreed to reinstate the Crucifix, and also to the parish volunteers who will help with labour and erecting the Cross. The above work will take several weeks, but we hope to have the Crucifix reinstated as quickly as we can.

Following Storm Isha was Storm Jocelyn, and Jocelyn brought her own troubles. During Storm Jocelyn the ceiling in the office of the house has come down, caused by extensive water damage. This will no doubt be an insurance job, and Fr John-Paul is in talks with builders and the Insurance Company to have these repairs carried out. Storm Jocelyn also caused some water ingress at the back of the church, mainly in the porch area. The tower and roof area will have to be inspected for damage and the paint damage to the walls and ceiling will have to be repaired. Again, we hope to have these repair works carried out as soon as possible.

Project Wellspring

Several months ago Fr John-Paul announced that the Diocese is launching Project Wellspring, to look at the Diocese as a whole and plan positively for the future. Project Wellspring is now going to be piloted through several parishes in the Diocese, one in each Deanery. We are delighted to announce that St Mary's is the chosen parish for the Wishaw Deanery. Very soon Fr John-Paul will gather a same group of parishioners, perhaps 4 or 5, to look at a parish renewal scheme. This stage will also take into account the questionnaire forms completed several months ago.

Initial talks will be to determine the needs of our parish and discern how best these needs can be met. This will also be a great opportunity to make sure that parishioners from Forth and Biggar feel included and valued within the parish, and what will work well for them. If you are approached by Fr John-Paul to join this Working Group please consider giving generously of your time.
