Lepra

Our vision is a world free from prejudice and disability due to leprosy.

Lepra is an international charity working to beat leprosy. We work directly with people in India, Bangladesh and Zimbabwe, prioritising marginalised and hard to reach communities to support people affected by leprosy and refer them for treatment and care.

Leprosy is a Neglected Tropical Disease which affects the skin and attacks nerves in the hands, feet and eyes. Leprosy is curable with a combination of antibiotics, known a multidrug therapy. However, left untreated it can cause severe disabilities and even blindness. Reconstructive surgery followed by physiotherapy can reverse the damage, helping people to use their hands, feet and eyes again.

Lepra offers a holistic approach to the treatment of leprosy, providing mental health support, and social and economic advocacy to ensure the needs of each individual are addressed.

Lepra's 5 key areas of work are:

Prevention

Detection

Treatment

Disability Support

Inclusion

Due to COVID-19, up to 80% fewer people are coming forward for leprosy diagnosis and treatment. Lepra reacted quickly to the pandemic, and through the provision of a PCR machine, has been at the forefront of testing for COVID-19 as well as leprosy in India. However, evidence now indicates that 63% of new cases of leprosy in India could be missed this year, in the wake of the pandemic. For 2021, and for 2022, Lepra's active case finding programme is ramping up in order to plug this gap.

St Joseph's Leprosy Centre was established in 1993 in the Khargone district of Madhya Pradesh, India and is run by the Sisters of St Joseph's. Reconstructive surgery is carried out at the centre to reverse damage caused to hands and feet, and the sisters care and support people through faith and love. St Joseph's also provides activities including counselling and self-care services, ulcer care, screening camps, advocacy, the teaching of new skills and protective footwear. These are all important for patients to support their families, particularly if they are unable to return to their old employment.

Gift Aid Appeal

As we begin to enter a new Financial Year, it is appropriate that the Parish offers everyone the opportunity to join the Gift Aid Scheme. If you are not already a member of the Gift Aid Scheme, and you pay tax on your pension or any earnings, we strongly encourage you to consider joining the Scheme. It takes minutes to join, your weekly donations can stay the same, and it is 100% confidential. For every £1 donated through Gift Aid, the Parish claims back 25%, at NO cost to you, it is claimed from the Government. Each Gift Aid user is issued a number, to keep all details confidential, and no matter how little or how large your offering, we can claim back 25% at the end of the Tax Year. If you would like to join the Gift Aid Scheme you can either, speak to Fr John-Paul, or fill out a Gift Aid Declaration Form and hand it in next week. If it is easier you can pop completed forms into the collection bag with your weekly offering and Fr John-Paul will deal with it from there. Last year St Mary's reclaimed £16,525.27 and St Isidore's £7,218.50. We are extremely grateful to those who support the church through Gift Aid, and with the rising cost of bills, we strongly encourage other tax payers to consider using the Scheme, and maximising your donations.
