5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 6th February 2022

A Foretaste Of Heaven



Our loving reception of the Lord in the Eucharist is the most intimate way in which the Trinity allow us to taste heaven on earth. This precious sacrament truly is the "pledge of future glory."

St. John Paul II describes with heartfelt emotion how we are raised to heaven when we are present at Mass, as we "become part of that great multitude which cries out: 'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!' (Rev. 7:10)." As we are raised to heaven, heaven itself comes down to us. Indeed, the sacrament of the

Eucharist, the most wondrous fruit of the Mass, is the sweetest taste and "glimpse of heaven on earth."

In writing about her first Holy Communion, St. Thérèse tells us that "all the joy of Heaven" entered her heart when she received the Lord. Unable to hold back her tears, she realized that when she received the Lord in the Eucharist, "heaven itself" was in her soul.

St. Thomas Aquinas, too, tenderly contemplates the power of the Eucharist to raise us to heaven and to enable us to live in heaven here on earth. The Eucharist is the greatest of all the sacraments, the culmination and purpose of every other sacrament, precisely because in it we receive the precious Body and Blood of God the Son

Because Jesus is "the Resurrection and the Life" (John 11:25), the Eucharist is the very cause of our eternal life in heaven: "Whoever eats of this Bread will live forever" (John 6:51).

Since the Lord is the font of all grace (John 1:16), devoutly receiving the Eucharist also deepens sanctifying grace and charity within us, "inebriating" us with heavenly delight. Meditating on the Scriptural words that "blood and water came out" of the pierced side of the crucified Lord (John 19:34), St. Thomas Aquinas reiterates the sentiments of St. John Chrysostom: "When you draw near to the awe-inspiring chalice, approach as if you were going to drink from Christ's own side."

Another wonderful effect of the Eucharist is a deepening in our souls of a profound spiritual delight and "sweetness" that allow us to taste heavenly joy even now: "Taste and see that the Lord is good" (Ps. 34:8). This deep contentment, even in the midst of trials, continues after we receive the Eucharist and especially can be savored when we spend time in adoration of the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

St. John Paul II tells us of his own intimate experience: "It is pleasant to spend time with him, to lie close to his breast like the beloved disciple (John 13:25) and to feel the infinite love present in his heart." The pope reminds us of how much every one of us truly needs this time in adoration and love before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. "How often, dear brothers and sisters, have I experienced this, and drawn from it strength, consolation and support!"

Covid Update - St Mary's

Track & Trace

As advised by the Diocesan Covid Coordinator we are now in a position to cease our current track & trace system. Therefore, when you attend Mass you will not be asked for your personal details or Parish Number, but you may wish to use the QR code to check-in, as is advised for visitors. We do kindly ask that you retain you Parish Number Card, just as a precaution if required in the future.

Offertory Collection

As we steadily return to normality in the Church, the weekly offertory collection will be reintroduced this weekend. The offertory collection will be taken up at the appropriate time, and will be carried out by the on duty pass-keepers. Once again thank you for your continued generosity, and to all those who have subscribed to using the Standing Order scheme.

Bidding Prayers

Bishop Toal has encouraged that a full Liturgy of the Word is proclaimed, and therefore in a few weeks time we will reintroduce Prayers of the Faithful, which take place at the end of the Creed.

Offertory Procession

Within the next few weeks we will also see the return of the Offertory Procession. This is an important part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist and symbolises our offerings to the Lord, the bread and wine to be consecrated into the Eucharist. We hope that you will be kind enough to accept the invitation if a pass-keeper ask you to take part in the Offertory Procession.

Sacrament of Confession

Bishop Toal has now advised all parishes to offer regular times for the Sacrament of Confession. Again, within the next few weeks we will look to reintroduce the Sacrament of Confession, and will update you with times and procedures once they have been agreed.

Eucharistic Adoration

As we now start to look beyond Covid and introduce more devotions to the parish, we propose some time of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. This will most probably happen prior to Mass and last 25 mins, all going well, this will begin in Lent.

RCIA

Bishop Toal has now advised all parishes to return to face-to-face meetings, and therefore we are looking to restart RCIA. On returning from his annual leave, Fr John-Paul will call a meeting of those who are on the RCIA Leaders Group with the hope or restarting RCIA sessions in late February.

Liturgical Calendar

Tuesday 8th February - Born in Venice (Italy) in 1486; died of the plague on this day in 1537 near Bergamo. An army officer who, after imprisonment, began a new life of service among the sick and destitute. Noted for his care and education of orphaned and homeless children, a ministry continued by the Somaschi, an order of clergy which he founded.

Thursday 10th February St Scholastica - Born at Norcia (Italy) about 480; died near Monte Cassino in the 540s. Like Saint Benedict, her brother and twin, she dedicated herself to God through the monastic life. Noted for her part in establishing Benedictine monasticism.

Friday 11th February Our Lady of Lourdes - Observed since 1907, this memorial celebrates the immaculate Virgin Mary as honoured in Lourdes (France). This site of apparitions to the young Bernadette Soubirous in 1858 has become a focus of devotion to Mary. It is a place of prayer and pilgrimage, of conversion and healing for Christians from every land.
