



The Sacraments: Holy Orders

Someone who is baptised and confirmed can receive moreover a special mission in the Church in two sacraments and thus be enlisted in the service of God: Holy Orders and Matrimony.

God disposed man and woman for each other so that they might be "no longer two but one" (Matthew 19:6). In this way they are to live in love, be fruitful, and thus become a sign of God himself, who is nothing but overflowing love.





As a rule a wedding must take place publicly. The bride and groom are questioned as to their intention to marry. The priest or deacon blesses their rings. The bride and groom exchange rings and mutually promise "to be true in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health" and vow to each other: " will love you and honour you all the days of my life". The priest ratifies the wedding and administers the blessing.

If a Catholic wishes to marry a non-Catholic Christian Church approval must be obtained for the wedding. This is because so-called "mixed marriages" requires from both partners a special fidelity to Christ and that any children from the marriage are raised in the Catholic faith. For Catholic believers, to enter into and live in marriage with a person with a person who belongs to another religion, a dispensation must be obtained.

The Church has great respect for the ability of a person to keep a promise and to bind themselves in lifelong fidelity. Every marriage can be endangered by crises. Someone for whom marriage has become unbearable, however, or who may be even exposed to spiritual or physical violence, may civilly divorce but the sacramental marriage remains valid. There are also cases in which the crisis in the marriage ultimately goes back to the fact that one spouse or both was not capable at the time of the wedding or did not fully consent to the marriage. Then the marriage is invalid. In such cases an annulment procedure can be introduced.

Liturgical Calendar

Sunday 2nd November, All Saints Day - This feast began in the East to commemorate all martyrs and was progressively adopted in the West. Celebrated on this day in the eighth century and soon widely observed. Honoured today are all holy men and women in glory with Christ: known or unknown, mighty or lowly, all whose lives were modelled on the Beatitudes and on the commandment of love.

Monday 3rd November, All Souls Day - This day of commemoration began early in the Middle Ages with annual prayers for the dead in monastic communities. Fixed on this day, it spread more widely after the tenth century and now ranks with the principal feast days in the liturgical calendar. Commonly known as All Souls, it expresses Christian faith in the communion of saints and our need to pray for one another in the Church, especially the souls in purgatory.

Tuesday 4th November, St Charels Borromeo, Bishop - Born in Arona (Italy) in 1538; died on this day in 1584 in Milan. Only twenty-two when he was appointed cardinal, secretary of state, and given the administration of the diocese of Milan by his uncle, Pius IV. Prominent in the final sessions of the Council of Trent during 1562—1563 and, at its end, was ordained presbyter, then bishop and became archbishop of Milan. Known for implementing the Council's reforms in liturgy, education, presbyteral formation, and diocesan organisation. Honoured as an exemplary and pastoral bishop and an ardent proponent of reform.
