# The Sacraments: Anointing of the Sick

In the Old Testament sickness was often experienced as a severe trial, against which one could protest but in which one could also see God's hand. In the prophets the thought appears that sufferings are not just a curse and not always the consequence of personal sin, that by patiently bearing sufferings one can also be there for others.

Jesus came in order to show God's love. He often did this in places where we feel especially threatened: in the weakening of our life through sickness. God wants us to become well in body and soul and, therefore, to believe and to acknowledge the coming of God's kingdom. He shows us that heaven suffers with us when we suffer, God even wants to be discovered in "the least of these my brethren" (Matthew 25:40). That is why Jesus designated care of the sick as a central task for his disciples. He commands, "Heal the sick" (Matthew 10:8), and he promises them divine authority: "In my name they will cast out demons;... they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover" (Mark 16:17-18).

One of the distinct characteristics of Catholicism has always been that the elderly, sick, and the needy are central. The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick can be received by any Catholic whose health is in a critical state. One can receive the Anointing of the Sick several times in one's life.

The essential ritual by which the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is administered consists of anointing the forehead and hands with holy oil (oil of Infirmorum) accompanied by prayers. As the priest anoints the head he says, "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you by the grace of the Holy Spirit", and as he anoints the palms of the hands he says, "May the Lord who frees you from sin, save you and raise you up".

The Anointing of the Sick imparts consolation, peace, and strength and unites the sick person, in their precarious situation and their sufferings, with Christ in a profound way. For the Lord experienced our fears and bore our pains in his body, For many people the Anointing of the Sick brings about physical healing and strength. But if God should decide to call someone home to himself, he gives them in the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick the strength for all physical and spiritual battles on their final journey from this world. In any case, the Anointing of the Sick has the effect of forgiving sins.



Administering the Anointing of the Sick is reserved to bishops and priests alone, for it is Christ who acts through them by virtue of their ordination. Viaticum can also be giving, meaning the last Communion that a person receives before dying. After the Second Vatican Councill many would comment there is no such thing as "the Last, that is untrue. There are special prayers for the seriously ill and dying which commends them to God's mercy on their journey from this world as they are being anointed.

#### **Liturgical Calendar**

Monday 10th November, St Leo the Great, Pope & Doctor - He died in Rome on this day in 461. Elected pope in 440. Tried to protect the city from the devastation of barbarian invasion. His surviving letters illustrate the leadership and guidance he exercised as bishop of Rome toward other Churches in the West. Noted for the clarity of his thought on the two natures of Christ, affirmed at the Council of Chalcedon, for his eloquent sermons, and for the prayers he composed for the Roman liturgy.

**Tuesday 11th November, St Martin of Tours, Bishop** - This Born in Pannonia (Hungary) about 316; died in 397 and was buried on this day in Tours (France). A catechumen who was in conscience unable to continue with military service. Baptised at the age of eighteen, for a time became a hermit, and then worked to establish monasticism in the West. Bishop of Tours for twenty-five years. One of the first non-martyrs to be venerated as a saint. Widely remembered for his legendary generosity to the poor, for arguing against the persecution of heretics, and especially for his active evangelisation and pastoral care of rural areas.

Wednesday 12th November, St Josaphat, Bishop & Martyr - Born in Vladimir (Ukraine) in 1580; died at Vitebsk (Belarus) on this day in 1623. A Basilian monk who became archbishop of Polotsk. Worked strenuously to uphold and spread the Union of Brest-Litovsk by which Churches of the province of Kiev, with their Byzantine liturgy and customs, had entered into communion with Rome. In a complex situation of national and religious antagonism, he was killed by violent opponents. Noted for his energetic pastoral reform and courageous ecumenism.
