Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

15th June 2025

The Trinity - Mystery or Puzzle?

The Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life, "the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them" (CCC 234). It is one of the mysteries of faith "that are hidden in God, which can never be known unless they are revealed by God" (CCC 237, quoting Dei Filius 4). And once this mystery is revealed to us in God's divine goodness, even though it seems an impenetrable paradox — one God in three Persons — we recognise that the reality of the Triune God is exactly what we need, what we were made for.



Often we are tempted to approach the Holy Trinity as a puzzle that needs to be solved. Countless analogies have been used to make sense of the one in three and three in one, like the analogy of water, ice, and vapor, or the three-leaf clover. The problem is that these analogies more often lead us astray in one way or another and give us an inadequate grasp of the Triune God.

We can also lose the true beauty of the Trinity when we only focus on trying to "solve the puzzle." Look again at our verse from First John, "God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them." John is not trying to help us solve a puzzle; instead, he wants us to see that the Triune God has created us so that we might share in his love, that we might abide in God and God in us.

It may be helpful to approach the Trinity similarly to how we would a beautiful painting. When you first encounter a beautiful work of art, you are drawn in by it. The beauty of the work itself is enough to keep you there, delighting in it. As you continue to look at it, its beauty and detail unfold before you, generating in you love and admiration for the work.

Only after the experience of the painting's beauty would you then begin to study how it was made, how it works, and what inspired the painter. Exploring these questions helps us return to the painting with a deeper understanding, delighting even more in its beauty. So it is with the Holy Trinity. First, we are drawn to delight in and love God as he has revealed himself to us; only then do we seek out to make sense of the Holy Trinity, but as we work through those questions, they draw us deeper again into the delight and love of God.



I believe in You, I hope in You, I adore You, O Blessed Trinity, One God.

Have mercy on me now and at the hour of my death, and save me. Amen.

Liturgical Calendar

Saturday 21st June, St Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious - Born in Lombardy (Italy) in 1568; died in Rome on this day in 1591 of the plague, contracted while caring for its victims. Devout and ascetical from the time of his childhood in a family of Italian nobility. Pursued a religious vocation as a Jesuit against enormous family opposition. Noted for his youthful ideal of perfection.

Sunday 22nd June, Saint John Fisher and Saint Thomas More, Martyrs

John Fisher: Born at Beverley (England) in 1469; died at London on this day in 1535. Chancellor at Cambridge and then Bishop at Rochester, combining diligent pastoral ministry with the defence of Catholic doctrine.

Thomas More: Born in London 1478; died there for the faith on 6 July 1535. An Oxford scholar, a noted humanist and apologist, an incorruptible judge and Lord Chancellor, a devoted husband and loving father. Drawn into conflict with Henry VIII, both were imprisoned and beheaded for treason. Noted for their wide learning, for their devotion to the Church, and for their uncompromising integrity and courage. An opportunity to celebrate all the English martyrs, Catholic and Protestant, of the Reformation era. Coming from every walk of life, people rich and poor, married and single, women and men died on the scaffold, perished in prison, or suffered harsh persecution for their faith.
